He was previously Professor of Geography at the University of Bristol and has also worked in the universities of Cardiff, Reading and Karlsruhe. His research is focused around the principles and techniques of geographic information science (GISc), with research applications in geodemographics, public service provision and urban morphological analysis. He is Editor-in-Chief of *Computers, Environment and Urban Systems* and Reviews Editor of *Environment and Planning B: Planning and Design*.
